Welcome back to school! We have had a very smooth start to the year and are hoping that this continues!

Please note the following staffing changes:

The start of this year marks the "beginning of the end" for our Class of 2019, a lovely group of students whom we have much faith an optimism in their abilities to contribute positively to our community after secondary school. It is also the beginning of the secondary school journey for our Class of 2023, another lovely group of students whom we are looking forward to getting to know.

Our Grade 8 through 10 students are all in classes using the revised British Columbia curricula—an exciting development that will make their learning experiences more meaningful and relevant. Teachers of these classes will be selected content and developing particular skills in order to help improve what have been determined to be the "Core Competencies" that should be highly developed in all students upon their graduation:

Communication, Creative Thinking, Critical Thinking, Positive

Personal and Cultural Identity, Personal Awareness and Responsibility, and Social Responsibility. We will work to make the connections between what is being taught in class and these competencies abundantly clear this year!

We have some exciting new technology developments in the school this year. We had all new hardware delivered to the school this month—over 250 iPads and laptop computers! In addition students all have logins to a "portal" where they will have access (at school and home) to software and file storage.

We always hope to start off the year with the philosophy of "taking care of the little things before they become big things" and invite students and

parents to bring any problems and concerns to our attention right away so we can work together to address them.

As always, I am grateful for the support and prayers for our school community.

How we report to parents/guardians will change next year.

This year, Vanier Catholic Secondary will be changing how we communicate students' learning to parents. Instead of four term report cards, students will only receive a formal written report at the end of each course. Throughout a course, parents can expect to receive more frequent informal reports about student progress – usually by email. It is essential that all parents/guardians have a working email account on file at the school.

Some notes about attendance...

- Attendance for all grades is taken in every class of each school day. Parents/guardians may, at any time, request a detailed report of their child's attendance.
- Students who arrive more than 10 minutes late to class are marked as 'absent' as, typically, most instruction is done in the first portion of the class period.
- Parents/guardians must contact the school to excuse absences or lates within 24 hours. Advance notice, when possible, is appreciated. We have voice mail so messages can be left at any time (667-5901) or email the details to vcss@gov.yk.ca.
- Students who are arriving to school late, or leaving school early, are required to check in at the office.
- Morning phone calls are made to parents/guardians if students are marked as unexcused absent in their first block class.
- An automated system calls households at 4 pm each day to report any periods where a student was marked as unexcused absent.
- Parents can opt into have these messages sent as SMS (Text) messages to your cell phone rather than voicemails. Consult the information sheet on the school's website for more details.

Vanier Tutoring Program

Starts September 4, 2017 to June 7, 2018

All Vanier students can receive free tutoring

for assistance in course work, assignments, organizational skills or test preparation.

Students will be matched one on one.

To receive tutoring the student needs to *fill in an application* in the Skills Room (Room 3).

Students in Grade 10, 11 or 12 can apply to be a tutor. Tutors can earn community service hours or an hourly wage. Potential tutors need to *come in person* to see Ms. Bergsma and *fill in an application*.



BOOSTER CARDS

Vanier Catholic Secondary only requires all students to participate in one fundraiser for the school each year—Booster Cards. These cards provide purchasers with discounts at a number of businesses in town and are a great deal!

SCHOOL FEE INFORMATION

Student Fees: The School Fee is used to cover the cost of student agendas, special assemblies, guest performance fees, special school activities, projects and project materials.

Student Fees

Individual \$25.00

Family \$50.00 (The family rate for student fees applies when there are more than two children from the same family attending Vanier Catholic Secondary School.)

Religious Education Fees:

Every family registering in our school community contributes to the cost of Religious Education materials, resources, activities, and professional development.

Religious Education Fees

Individual \$25.00

Family \$45.00 (The family rate for religious education fees applies when there are two or more children from the same family attending any of the Catholic schools of Whitehorse.)

All students attending Yukon's Catholic schools must pay these fees.

Athletic Fees: Various sports teams require a fee to pay for uniforms, tournament fees, sport governing body fees, referee payments, local busing, and school athletic banquet. Travel costs to certain tournaments outside of Whitehorse will be additional. Coaches will send home documentation for all fees and travel costs.

If paying any or all of these fees presents an undue hardship on your family, please contact the school's administration.

Fees can be paid by:

- Cash (please bring in person and wait for a receipt to be issued)
- Cheque (please make sure the cheque is payable to the proper entity – see below)
- Email money transfer to vcss@gov.yk.ca
- Using our online payment system for credit cards (linked from school website; requires parents/guardians to pay an additional processing fee)
