Vanier Catholic Secondary School Guide to Scholarships and Bursaries



There are numerous scholarships, bursaries and financial awards available to Yukon students entering post-secondary institutions, whether they be colleges, universities, or trade institutes. Students are also eligible for the Yukon Grant, and, depending on marks, may also be eligible for the Yukon Excellence Award.

Students should check with their employers, parent's employers, coaches and associations for the availability of other scholarships. Additionally, students should research financial assistance programs and scholarships specific to the post-secondary institution they plan on attending.

Students in serious financial need should inquire about student loans, tuition assistance, bursary funds and work-study programs that are specific to each post-secondary institution. Canada Student Loans and Grants are also available.

Apply for as many scholarships as possible but choose those for which you have are *realistically eligible*. Be prepared to spend time and effort on your applications. Successful scholarship applications are the result of care, good supporting documents, and attention to detail. Remember that scholarships are won in competition with other students.

SCHOLARSHIPS, GRANTS AND BURSARIES

Scholarships, grants and bursaries are types of financial assistance that you don't have to pay back. Scholarships are typically based on merit, while grants and bursaries usually take financial need into consideration as well. Some scholarships, grants and bursaries are also based on academic achievement, athletic skill, extra-curricular involvement, or special abilities.

The bursary is usually \$400.00.

- A self directed, responsible, lifelong learner:
 - o Have you set appropriate goals and priorities in school, work and your personal life?
 - o Do you participate in leisure and fitness activities for a balanced and healthy lifestyle?

• A collaborative contributor:

- o Can you work effectively as a team member? Have you provided leadership in the achievement of individual and group goals?
- o Do you demonstrate respect for the rights, responsibilities and contributions of others?

• A caring family member:

The Yukon Grant

Students can receive up to 170 weeks of funding over their lifetime. You must continue to meet eligibility requirements.

To be eligible, you must:

- be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident;
- study at a designated institution anywhere in the world;
- be a full-time student:
- meet 1 of the following requirements:
 - o completed 2 years of secondary school in Yukon;
 - o if you are younger than 20, have resided in Yukon continuously since the age of 14; or
 - o in any other case, live in Yukon from the age of 14 to the age of 18.

The health professionals education bursary supports people who live or have lived in Yukon to attend a health education program. This is to prepare them for front line entry into 1 of the identified priority areas within the health sector.

Each year, a minimum of 6 new students receive the bursary over 4 years of study:

- 2 bursaries will be awarded for \$5,000 bursaries to the 2-top-scored students for a maximum of \$20,000; and
- 4 bursaries will be awarded for \$2,500 for a maximum of \$10,000.
- Canadian citizens or permanent residents who live or have lived in Yukon.
- Yukon Students enrolled in a Canadian health education or nursing program. Students who received the Yukon Grant.

The Yukon Retired Teachers' Alumni Scholarship

- The Yukon Retired Teachers' Alumni (YRTA) would like to encourage young Yukoners to return and teach in the Yukon. To this end, the YRTA offers a student entering, or already in, education, one \$500.00 scholarship.
- The recipients must satisfy the following criteria:
 - The award will be made on the basis of scholarship. A minimum standard will be deemed to be an overall average of 75% with 66% as the lowest acceptable subject mark.
 - The award will be made to a student who is entering or has entered the faculty of education.
 - Where more than two candidates are judged of equal worth, financial need may be taken into consideration.
 - Preference in awarding the scholarship will be given to graduates who have completed the major portion of their education in the Yukon system and who are in, or entering, the field of education.

• YTA 50th Anniversary Bursary

- Applicants must already be accepted to a formal post-secondary program that will lead to the granting of a trades ticket, diploma or degree.
- Regardless of an applicant's possible post-secondary academic achievements or credits earned to date, it will only be the applicant's grade 12 marks on a Yukon high school transcript that will be considered (high school graduation within last 5 years). The applicant with the highest average will be awarded the scholarship. In the unlikely event of candidates having equal averages, the names of the tied candidates will be placed in a container and the winner will be drawn randomly.
- Winners of the other 3 YTA scholarships on offer (Doris Stenbraten Scholarship, Mary Gartside Scholarship, Elijah Smith Scholarship) are ineligible for this bursary.

Mary Gartside Scholarship

- The applicant must already be accepted to an undergraduate program that leads to eligibility for teacher certification.

If there are no Yukon First Nations applicants (as indicated on the applications) who also meet the criteria listed below, selection will be open to other applicants who meet the listed criteria.
- O Applicants who have already been accepted to a First Nations Studies program, or an undergraduate program that leads to eligibility for teacher certification will be considered first. If there are no applicants who have already been accepted to a First Nations Studies program, or an undergraduate program that leads to eligibility for teacher certification, who also meet the criteria listed below, selection will be open to other applicants who meet the listed criteria.
- The successful applicant for either the Doris Stenbraten Scholarship or the Mary Gartside Scholarship of \$750 will be automatically disqualified from consideration for this scholarship. All other applicants for the Doris Stenbraten Scholarship and the Mary Gartside Scholarship remain eligible for this scholarship.
- o Applicants must already be accepted to an undergraduate degree program.
- Regardless of an applicant's possible post-secondary academic achievements or credits earned to date, it will only be the applicant's grade 12 marks on a Yukon high school transcript that will be considered. The applicant's grade 12 average mark from a Yukon high school transcript must be at least 75%, with no mark below 66%. The applicant with the highest average (provided no mark is below 66%) will be awarded the scholarship. In the unlikely event of candidates having equal averages, the names of the tied candidates will be placed in a container and the winner will be drawn randomly.

EMERGING ARTIST SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

In collaboration with corporate, foundation and individual donors, YVR Art Foundation offers up to eight visual art scholarships annually to BC and Yukon Indigenous Emerging Artists (age 17-29) who wish to develop their artistic potential. The Emerging Artist Scholarship award enables artists to study/work with an artist mentor or attend a recognized school of art over a one-year period. The Emerging Artist Scholarship recipients are selected through a juried process and each award is for \$5,000.

The Emerging Artist Scholarship Award is not just a monetary award. Scholarship recipients are brought to Vancouver, taken on a tour of the YVR Art Collection, and are invited along with their families to a Scholarship Awards event. The following day, after a complimentary hotel stay, recipients tour a variety of galleries, museums, and artist studios before returning home. The Emerging Artist Scholarship award provides recipients with inspiration, contacts, exposure to the art community, and ongoing support, not only during the award year, but in the years to come.

In addition, at the conclusion of the scholarship year, recipients are brought back to Vancouver for a display of their completed art work at the awards event, after which their work is exhibited at YVR, where it is seen by the 25 million local and international passengers travelling through Vancouver International Airport each year.
